Welcome to Fort Herriman Middle School! The administration and faculty at Fort Herriman believe that communication and organization are key components for middle school students to make a smooth and successful transition between elementary school and high school. In an effort to streamline this organizational process, we ask for your support for the following school-wide policies.

Students are expected to follow the Diamondback Traits in all areas of the campus, both inside and outside of the building, including classrooms, gym, cafeteria, hallways, auditorium, library, restrooms, and computer labs. Consequences for positive and negative behaviors are:

## **Parent/Guardian Communication**

Students and parents can stay well informed about class work, homework assignments, and other important school information by utilizing the website. #### **School-wide Intervention Programs**

FHMS believes that the best academic intervention occurs in the classroom. We also recognize that students often need additional support and time not available in the regular classroom. School-wide interventions include: Diamond Time, TA tutoring, after-school tutoring, team time, and Essential Intervention. Many of these interventions take place during Teacher Advisory (TA) time. On days when regular TA is in session, students not in need of specific interventions will be expected to participate in various teacher-led activities.

#### **Grading Policy**

FHMS implements a standards-referenced grading model. 80% of a student's grade will be based on assessments that demonstrate proficiency of state standards and objectives. The remaining 20% will be based on assignments that are given to prepare him or her for these assessments. Student assessments will be scored on a 4, 3, 2, 1 point system. An untaken assessment may be given a score of 0. This grade will change once the student takes the assessment to demonstrate their learning. Assignments will be scored on a 4, 2, 0 scale. These points will convert to an academic grade at the end of the quarter. Academic grades will be A, B, C, D, I or F, with no plus (+) or minus (-) grades given. There will be no opportunities for extra credit.

#### School-wide Late Work / Retake Policy

FHMS believes in allowing students to demonstrate proficiency. Some students may need more time and/or opportunities to demonstrate this proficiency. In line with this philosophy, there is no academic penalty for turning in late assignments. That being said, teachers may identify major projects (assessments) that will not be accepted late (i.e., book reports, science projects, final essays, etc.). End-of-quarter deadlines will be set and enforced to meet grade reporting deadlines.

As part of demonstrating proficiency of learning, students are also able to retake/redo assessments. Students may retake assessments as many times as necessary, **but must complete all corresponding assignments before being allowed a retake opportunity.** Students may also be asked to complete a homework/retake ticket before an assessment retake is available.

## School-wide Make-Up Work Policy

It is the student's responsibility to ask teachers for assignments missed due to absence. Many teachers have websites, blogs, and Google classroom where parents and students can access work that was missed during an absence.

## School-wide Tardy Policy

Students are expected to be in the classroom with their materials ready when the tardy bell rings. Excessive tardies may affect students' citizenship grades and will result in school consequences.

\*A "1" in any category will result in a "Needs Improvement" as the best possible citizenship grade for that class. Each teacher will individually work with students who want to improve their citizenship grade. Please note: Poor citizenship grades may affect your eligibility to participate in extracurricular activities.

#### **School-wide Electronic Device Policy**

Cell phones and other electronic devices are allowed in class at the discretion of the classroom teacher. If students use electronic devices at inappropriate times or for inappropriate reasons, they may be subject to confiscation. Please avoid calling/texting your child during school time. If you need to contact your child, call the attendance office.

Students are expected to be prepared at school each day with the needed supplies to be successful. Please check regularly with your student to make sure they have these supplies, which include paper, pencil, pen, colored pencils, binder/folder, etc.
